# Cumberland Health Care CAREERS BURSARY PROGRAM

Congratulations on choosing to pursue a career in health care! Now that you have made this important decision, we are pleased to share information on an opportunity for you to receive financial assistance for your education and receive support with your transition from post-secondary education into your new workplace.

## THE PROGRAM

Under the terms and conditions of the program, which is open only to Cumberland County students, successful applicants will receive a bursary of \$5,000 per year to support their health care career studies. Students sign a contract with the health authority for “return for service” equal to the number of years for which they receive a bursary. Upon graduation you will be placed, at the discretion of Nova Scotia Health, in a position where there is the greatest need for staff with your type of training. You’ll be starting your career in a place where you can practice your skills, meet new colleagues, learn from seasoned professionals, and help people from your own community. You could work in health care facilities in Advocate Harbour, Amherst, Parrsboro, Pugwash or Springhill.

In order to be considered for a bursary, we ask you to complete the enclosed application form and submit it along with the required supporting documents.

## BURSARY WINNERS

Bursary winners will be required to sign a return-of-service contract with Nova Scotia Health equal to the number of years for which they receive a bursary. This means that if you receive a bursary for four years of study then you will be expected to work for the Nova Scotia Health, in Cumberland County, for four years following graduation. If you cannot fulfill the agreement you will return the bursary that was awarded to you.

The bursary will be issued for each year of your studies, you do not need to reapply annually.

During your academic program you will be invited to meet with Nova Scotia Health staff who work in your area of study. You will be encouraged to build relationships, and perhaps job shadow, when possible.

Following graduation students will be placed, at the discretion of Nova Scotia Health, where there is the greatest need for staff with their type of training. Placements could be at any of our Cumberland County facilities located in Advocate Harbour, Amherst, Parrsboro, Pugwash or Springhill.

Students can also participate in summer work experience when possible. Bursary payments will be issued to students in time for academic deadlines.

## STEP-BY-STEP

# How to apply

If you’re a Cumberland County resident enrolled in a health care program at a university or college, you can apply for the \$5,000 per year Cumberland Health Care Careers Bursary. We welcome you to inform us if you require any help or accommodations in order to participate fully in our application process.

## BURSARY CRITERIA

You must be a student from Cumberland County, NS. Eligibility will be based on:

- Projected need for your area of study within Nova Scotia Health, Cumberland.
- Proof of acceptance into your program of study.
- Your official academic transcripts.
- A resume detailing your academic and community involvements.
- Your submission of a 750-word essay on why you chose this career path and how you believe your selection to receive a bursary would benefit Nova Scotia Health, and the community, following your graduation.
- Three letters of reference in support of your participation in the program.

## APPLICATION STEPS

1. Complete the application form and check the application for details on all required supporting documents.
2. Send in your completed application and supporting documents

## CHECKLIST

Make sure you provide:

- The completed application form with full contact information
- Your essay with your name on it
- Confirmation of enrollment in university or college (tuition receipt or letter from Registrar’s Office or an instructor)
- Your academic transcripts
- Three letters of reference

Incomplete applications will not be considered.

## HOW LONG IT TAKES

It should take two weeks after the application deadline to find out if you have been selected for an interview. It can take longer if there’s a large number of applications (not all applicants will be shortlisted).

Selected applicants will be interviewed by a panel of health care representatives (interviews last approximately 45 minutes each). The interview is important; it helps to prepare yourself ahead of time.

Successful bursary candidates will be notified within two weeks following their interview.

Unsuccessful applicants are encouraged to reapply the following year.

## COST

There is no cost to apply for the bursary.
